Classifying plants for wetlands


Populus tremuloides classification

A crash course in identifying wetlands:

“...areas that are inundated or saturated by surface...or ground water at a frequency and duration sufficient to support and, that under normal circumstances do support, a prevalence of vegetation typically adapted for life in saturated soil conditions.”



Wetland indicator status of plants

Indicator Status Ratings

Indicator Status	Abrv.	Definitions - Short Version (ERDC/CRREL TN-12-1)
Obligate	OBL	Almost always occur in wetlands.
Facultative Wetland	FACW	Usually occur in wetlands, but may occur in non-wetlands.
Facultative	FAC	Occur in wetlands and nonwetlands.
Facultative Upland	FACU	Usually occur in non-wetlands, but may occur in wetlands.
Upland	UPL	Almost never occur in wetlands.


